FOREST COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF LAKES, INC. ANNUAL MEETING LIVE & VIA ZOOM OCTOBER 15, 2021, STARTING AT 9:30 AM

<u>Call to Order</u>: President Pam Schroeder called the annual meeting to order at 9:40 am and declared a quorum was met.

Pam Schroeder declared a quorum was met.

INTRODUCTIONS – Members introduced themselves. Pam Schroeder thanked our business partners for their continued support:

Laona State Bank Associated Bank Johnny's Resort on Lake Wabikon Schaefer's Charlie's on Lake Metonga **AGENDA** -- Motion to accept the agenda was made by Curt Haga and seconded by Larry Sommer. Motion passed unanimously.

SECRETARY REPORT -- Kathy Babcock reviewed the minutes from the last Annual Meeting of October 19, 2019 and reminded the group that there was no annual meeting in 2020 due to COVID restrictions. Motion to accept the minutes from the 2019 annual meeting was made by Greg Schmitz and seconded by Harry Resch. Motion passed unanimously. Also reviewed were the minutes from the February 19, 2021 meeting as they provided an overview of some 2020 Board of Directors appointments that will need to be approved by the general membership at today's meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Treasurer Bob Ebben distributed and reviewed the following handouts: "Register Report", "Current Budget-Current Year", "Itemized Categories – Year to Date" (shows a summary of what has been taken in and spent to date), and "Net Worth as of 10/12/2021".

He noted that although we were living well within our budget there were a few explanations needed:

- 1) we over-spent in a few categories as we took care of expenditures that we didn't include in the budget these will be accounted for in the next budget;
- 2) we show a deficit in the budget of \$1972.03;
- 3) the deficit was due in part to our anticipating \$2,000 in grant money from the tribes, but as Mole Lake and the Potawatomi were shut down due to COVID, their grant monies were not available;
- the above is balanced out as we had no annual dinner/meeting expenses due to COVID cancellations;
- 5) we now have 501 3c status, which will allow us to apply for grants from the Potawatomi in the future.

Our Net Worth is \$18,566.42, which is more than last year. Bob Ebben explained this was due to saving money by not having the annual meeting/dinner in 2020 and because we began to offer our members a 5-year membership dues prepayment option.

The insurance expenses we incurred were due to updating our liability policy that covers the organization and the board of directors and officers.

Harry Resch made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented, seconded by Curt Haga. Motion carried unanimously.

At the next meeting of the board of directors, we will discuss our need to update our membership forms to include the increased membership price for one year of \$25.00 per family or for five years for \$100.00. Business partners are \$50.00 per year.

OLD BUSINESS

President's Report -- Pam Schroeder reported on the following activities:

Nov. 2020 – Our first Board meeting via ZOOM and first FCAL activity since March of 2020 due to COVID restrictions

February 2021 – Jim Weinser was appointed to the Board of Directors to represent Lake Lucerne Advancement Association; Larry Sommer continues as a rep. from Lake Lucerne, and also our liaison to Lumberjack RC & D.

April -2021 – Begin meeting simultaneously "in person" at the Crandon Public Library and via ZOOM. Dan Verbanac was appointed FCAL representative for Silver Lake.

May 2021 – ran the essay contest (contacted area schools, received the essays and ran the judging).

June 2021 – contacted winners of the essay contest, their schools and families (1st place =\$100; 2nd place = \$50.00; 3rd place = \$25.00; Honorable Mention \$10.00 (donated by Clair Carty) – submitted article and pictures of essay winners to local papers.

July 2021 – worked on tabletop display for Kentuck Days; WRISC sent Dana to help us support our booth and Derek Thorn of FLOW-AIS spent the day representing us at Kentuck Days as did a number of our board members. Thanks go out to all involved.

August 2021 – <u>Fall Forum</u> – Steve Kircher and Derek Thorn presented. We thank the Lake Lucerne Advancement Association for donating the use of their pavilion. 25 people represented 12 lakes at this year's forum. Derek T. and Steve K.

identified good and bad species brought in from the different lakes. The banded mystery snail was identified for Lake Metonga and added to the DNR list of invasive species in that lake.

September 2021 – <u>Environmental Days</u> cancelled due to COVID and the work being done to improve Veteran's Park. <u>Annual Banquet</u> cancelled. Christian Cold,

wildlife presenter, and the essay contest winners who had sent in a reservation were contacted. <u>Non-Lead Sinker Packets</u> were assembled by board members after the meeting. Thank you to Greg Schmitz for gathering these supplies.

Introduction of our Liaisons

FLOW-AIS – Derek Thorn was introduced as the Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator of Forest, Langlade, Oconto, and Washington counties.

Land And Water Conservation Dept. – Steve Kircher was introduced as the head of this Forest County department.

Lumberjack RC & D – Larry Sommer was introduced as secretary for this organization.

Annual Banquet & Program Status – The annual dinner had to be cancelled due to COVID. We are considering holding the annual banquet later this spring if COVID restrictions are lifted. Chris Cold was contacted to cancel his engagement as speaker at our Annual Banquet – he says he will be open to presenting for us in the future.

4) The following lakes currently do not have representation on the board of directors: Bishop, Ground Hemlock, Howell, Julia, Kentuck, and Pickerel.
